#### **Engineering Department:**

- The Engineering Department is using this time to continue work on State and Federal Stormwater permit requirements, particularly compliance efforts such as reports/submittals where there are upcoming due dates.
- They are also preparing State and local documentation for grants, and sales/gas
  tax performance reports with upcoming due dates. Examples are Park Village
  grants, and SB1 and Measure M funding annual reports for streets/vehicle, bicycle
  & pedestrian safety.

#### **Fire Department:**

- The Fire Department is open and continuing to provide first response and emergency services as usual.
- Please note that the Fire Department lobby and business office are closed.

#### **Planning Department:**

- Water and sewer utility systems continue to be monitored and maintained.
- The Public Works Department has begun the dismantling of the Libby Playground in anticipation of being able to install the new structure in mid to late May. This will be an important project for the community to be able to access once public isolation is lifted.

# PLANNING DEPARTMENT NEWS

#### **MEETING REVIEWS:**

The DRB/Tree Board met April 15th for their first public meeting via virtual meeting procedures. They took the following actions:

- **Approved** the design of the outdoor patio for Vineshift/Region wine tasting room at 180 Morris Street within the Barlow. The Use Permit was approved by the Planning Commission at its January 14, 2020 meeting.
- Approved the revised option 3 for Bare Radiance Studio on Weeks Way for modifications to the façade of an existing building. The project proposes to add decorative bamboo elements to the existing building and modify awnings.
- Continued the Design Review for 6950 Burnett St to the May 6 DRB

meeting (continuation was requested by the applicant). This application is for a complete remodel of the building (formerly Round Table Pizza restaurant and Sonoma West Times office), including facade improvements, a rooftop deck, and an elevator.

Nominated Vice Chair Lars Langberg and Member Christine Level to be the
two representatives for the City's Design Guideline Subcommittee, who will joint
Mayor Slayter and Planning Commissioner Paul Fritz. The Subcommittee is now
complete.



# SEBASTOPOL RESIDENTS PARTICIPATE IN THE 2020 CENSUS

Thank you Sebastopol residents for participating in the 2020 Census and congratulations for having the highest response rate in Sonoma County! If you haven't filled yours out yet, be sure to get counted.

Responding to the 2020 Census is our civic duty and affects the allocation of funding for our community's public resources, how we plan for the future, and our voice in government.

## **ESSENTIAL SERVICES WILL CONTINUE:**

- The City of Sebastopol will not turn off water due to nonpayment. The City recognizes the hardship that the pandemic and resulting Shelter in Place Orders, have created in our community, and will temporarily suspend non-emergency turnoffs and late fees.
- PG&E will not cut off power due to nonpayment. PG&E voluntarily implemented a moratorium on service disconnections for non-payment, effective immediately. This suspension will apply to both residential and commercial customers and will remain in effect until further notice.
- Recology will not suspend trash service due to nonpayment. Recology understands that customers are starting to request delay of payments or payment plans due to the circumstances, and they are sensitive to what the community is going through. Recology will not stop service due to non-payment at this time.

NEW HAND WASHING STATIONS INSTALLED IN DOWNTOWN SEBASTOPOL

Sebastopol Public Works has installed three new hand washing stations in the downtown area: at the Sebastopol Police Department, on Petaluma Ave conveniently located next to Screamin' Mimi's, and at 328 N. Main Street - on sidewalk entrance Community Bank parking lot.

These three new stations are in addition to the three already in place in Downtown Sebastopol: at the City parking lot at Main St. and Burnett, on Sebastopol Ave. (Route 12) at the alley between Ramen Gaijen and WestAmerica Bank, and adjacent to the southwest corner of Town Plaza parking lot against the rear wall of Silk Moon.

# HEALTH OFFICER NOW REQUIRES FACE COVERINGS FOR GENERAL PUBLIC IN ALL AGE GROUPS



Following updated information from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Sonoma County Health Officer now requires that everyone who leaves home for an essential activity in our community wear a face covering – such as a scarf, bandana, neck gaiter, or similar garment.

The <u>Order</u> is effective at **12:01 a.m. on Friday April 17**, **2020**, and will continue to be in effect until it is rescinded, superseded, or amended in writing by the Health Officer or the State Health Officer.

"These measures recently put in place are having an effect in limiting the spread of COVID-19 in Sonoma County. The use of facial coverings is another strategy to stop the virus from spreading from infected people who do not present symptoms. As we approach an expected surge in cases, we are increasing protective measures," said Dr. Sundari Mase, Sonoma County Health Officer.
