Police Department:





MORATORIUM ON EVICTIONS

The City Council strongly believes that during this crisis both residential and commercial tenants should be protected from eviction resulting from nonpayment of rent due to the financial impacts.

Fortunately, there are three such measures recently put into effect:

- The <u>County of Sonoma's residential eviction moratorium</u>, which applies in Sebastopol as well as the other cities in the County;
- 2. Governor Newsome's <u>Executive Order N-37-20</u> which provides similar protection throughout the entire state, and
- 3. Recent <u>action by the Judicial Council</u> which prevents the filing of both residential and commercial eviction actions, as well as judicial mortgage foreclosure actions in the State.

The City will make more detailed information on these measures available in future editions. Tenants faced with an action appearing to be in violation of this protection should seek legal advice immediately.

ESSENTIAL SERVICES WILL CONTINUE:

- The City of Sebastopol will not turn off water due to nonpayment. The City recognizes the hardship that the pandemic and resulting Shelter in Place Orders, have created in our community. We want to reassure our residents that the water and sewer systems are operating as usual. During this national emergency, the City of Sebastopol will temporarily suspend non-emergency turnoffs and late fees. Once the crisis has passed, the City will work with customers to set up bill payment plans.
- PG&E will not cut off power due to nonpayment. PG&E voluntarily implemented a moratorium on service disconnections for non-payment, effective immediately. This suspension will apply to both residential and commercial customers and will remain in effect until further notice. To further support customers who may be impacted by the pandemic, PG&E will offer its most flexible pay plans to customers who indicate either an impact or hardship as a result of COVID-19. PG&E will continue to monitor current events and identify opportunities to support our customers and communities.
- Recology will not suspend trash service due to nonpayment. Recology understands that customers are starting to request delay of payments or payment plans due to the circumstances, and they are sensitive to what the community is going through. Recology will not stop service due to non-payment at this time. If a customer calls in that has been impacted by COVID-19, Recology can work with them to create a payment plan. Additionally, businesses and schools can call to suspend their service at no charge until they open back up again. HEALTH OFFICER NOW RECOMMENDS FACE COVERINGS FOR GENERAL PUBLIC IN ALL AGE GROUPS



Following updated information from the Center for Diseases and Control (CDC), the Sonoma County Health Officer now recommends that everyone who leaves home for an essential activity in our community wear a face covering – to the extent possible – such as a scarf, bandana, neck gaiter, or similar garment. Although ordinary face coverings are not proven to protect the wearer, when worn by someone with COVID-19, they may reduce the risk of

spreading the virus to others. Since not everyone with COVID-19 knows they are sick, wearing a face covering helps make sure you don't unknowingly affect others. As a reminder, wearing a face covering or mask is NOT a substitute for social distancing. Please continue to adhere to social distancing practices even when wearing one. DON'T FLUSH WIPES!

Flushing wipes, paper towels and similar products down toilets will clog sewers and cause backups and overflows at wastewater treatment facilities, creating an additional public health risk in the midst of the coronavirus pandemic. Even wipes labeled "flushable" will clog pipes and interfere with sewage collection and treatment throughout the state. Preventing sewer spills is important, especially during this COVID-19 emergency, for the protection of public health and the environment. Please do not flush disinfectant wipes or paper towels down the toilet.
