




# Sonoma County is now in the orange tier of California's Blueprint for a Safer Economy

# ZERO WASTE SONOMA HOSTING FREE TREATED WOOD WASTE DISPOSAL EVENT APRIL 25

Zero Waste Sonoma is offering a **free** treated wood waste (TWW) disposal event on **Sunday**, **April 25th** in the northern Santa Rosa area. This event is for residents of Sonoma County only, no businesses. State transportation



laws limit each vehicle to a maximum of 125 pounds of hazardous waste. The address of the location will be emailed to you once you confirm an appointment.





This calendar shows time slots that are available for the drop-off of TWW. To make an appointment, click on the time slot you'd prefer. There are 160 available appointments between the hours of 9 am to 5 pm and a confirmation email will be sent to you for your records.

## THIEVES ARE STILL ON THE PROWL FOR CATALYTIC **CONVERTERS IN SEBASTOPOL**



## **WARNING!**

A catalytic converter is located underneath your car and is attached to your exhaust system. Since catalytic converters contain expensive metals like platinum, palladium and rhodium, they are often stolen and "scrapped" for a quick profit. Thieves often use power saws in the middle of the night to quickly cut the converters



off. The City of Sebastopol and other parts of Sonoma County have recently seen an increase in the number of catalytic converter thefts. If you have a Toyota Prius, you're most at risk.

Below are some prevention tips that can help reduce your risk.

- Parking in your enclosed garage is always best.
- If parked outside, park in front of high-resolution security cameras and motion lights.
- Install a catalytic converter protection device (usually around \$500).
- Etch your converter with your vehicle's license plate number in several different locations.
- If your converter is stolen, file a police report immediately after the theft is discovered.
- Spread community awareness. Thieves sometimes strike repeatedly in the same neighborhoods so it's good for the neighbors to be aware.

## **ASK SLOW CAT!**

**THIS WEEK'S QUESTION:** Which Native American tribe or tribes inhabited Sebastopol before white people showed-up? Have archaeologists found campsites and/or artifacts?

**ANSWER:** We reached out to several tribal organizations to help answer this question. Nicole Lim, Executive Director of The California Indian Museum and Cultural Center (<a href="www.cimcc.org">www.cimcc.org</a>) was kind enough to share the following information with us: "Sebastopol is part of the ancestral territory



of the Coast Miwok people. The area includes traditional tribal village and archeological sites, which are located in this region and throughout the greater state of California." Nicole adds, "Tribal sites should not be disturbed. Consultation with the Federated Tribes of Graton Rancheria Cultural Monitoring program and the Native American Heritage Commission is required."

This is a big topic! We would like to find out more about the lives of the Miwok and the archeological discoveries in our area. We have lots of feelers out. If we receive additional details, we will add them in a future edition of "Ask Slow Cat."

P.S. The CIMCC website is a fascinating resource to learn more about California's early inhabitants.



## SIGN UP FOR ALERTS

Make sure that you have signed up for:

SoCoAlerts; and

Nixle Alerts (either online or by texting your zip code to 888777)

It is important to register for both types of alerts. If you receive Nixle alerts, read them thoroughly and click on any links.

Text Fire or Fuego (for Spanish) to 211-211 for updates.

# **KNOW YOUR ALERTS**

The City of Sebastopol uses multiple notifications and warning systems to make sure emergency alerts are delivered to the people who need the information.



## **Emergency Alert System (EAS) - No Registration Required**

National public warning system that will interrupt local broadcast tv and radio programming to provide an alert in the event of a large-scale emergency.



## Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) - No Registration Required

Urgent alerts sent as text-like messages to your mobile phone based on your location (you will only receive notification if you are in the area of the emergency). WEAs have three alert categories—Imminent Threat, AMBER, Presidential. You must keep the factory settings on to your WEA- capable phone to receive a WEA.



## SoCoAlert - Registration Required

Emergency notification service providing Sonoma County first responders the ability to alert residents by landline or mobile phone, text message and email about imminent threats to life and property in specific impacted areas. Register all addresses that you'd like to receive alerts for (work, child's school, etc.). You don't have to be in the location of the emergency to receive alert.

Must register at <u>SoCoAlert.com</u> OR call (866) 939-0911, press "0" at the menu, ask operator for assistance with registering for SoCoAlert.



## **Nixle - Registration Required**

Community information service managed by Sonoma County Fire District and Sonoma County Sheriff's Office. Community messages are sent to email, and for critical emergencies, Alert messages are sent via text message and email (notifications are NOT delivered by phone call). Customize your settings at nixle.com to control which types of notifications you receive. Must register at <a href="mailto:nixle.com">nixle.com</a> or text your zip code to 888-777



## **Local Radio and Television**

Local news broadcasters to provide updates during an emergency. Tune radio to 1350 AM, 103.5 FM, 100.1 FM, 89.1 FM (bilingual), 98.7 FM (Spanish); watch preferred local TV news channel.



## Hi/Lo Sirens

Sebastopol police cars and fire department vehicles are outfitted with new Hi/Lo sirens, a different sound than traditional sirens. This European-style, 2-tone siren will only be used in an emergency to alert residents within specific areas of the need to evacuate.

## **ARE YOU FLOOD READY?**

The rainy season runs from October to May. The most severe flooding historically occurs between December and March. During this time you should be aware of anticipated weather conditions and take appropriate actions.

Know the flood warning signals: The Police, Fire Department, Public Works Department and Emergency Manager for the city are notified of rising floodwaters. Listen for Flood Warnings on local TV, and radio station KRSO 1350. Sign up for local alerts on your mobile phone. Be sure to heed the flood warnings.
