

WATER LINE WORK ON LELAND & JEWELL

begun replacement of existing water facilities along Leland Avenue (First St. to Jewell Ave.) and Jewell Avenue (Leland Ave. to Calder Ave.). The project is necessary to ensure the integrity and reliability of the City of Sebastopol's water system. Mark-out utility locating work started on June 13th, 2022 and the mainline pipe installation got underway on June 14th, 2022. The new water system is scheduled to



be completed by approximately July 20th, 2022. Work hours from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

During construction, please be aware of heavy equipment and construction personnel and follow instruction of the contractor's flaggers and signs. Residents will always have access to their homes, but it may take a few minutes to clear a safe path. Please be patient. Please reduce your travel speed to maintain safe conditions within the construction zone. Noise levels will be increased during construction.

PREVENT EQUIPMENT SPARKED FIRES!

Prevent equipment sparked fires. Are you doing the right thing the wrong way?

- Lawn mowers are designed to mow lawns, NOT weeds or dry grass.
- Be cautious of rocks, metal blades striking rocks create sparks and start fires.
- Ensure your chainsaw has a spark arrester and is working properly.
- Be sure to mow your lawn BEFORE 10 a.m., have a fire extinguisher and/or hose nearby, and NEVER mow if it's windy or excessively dry!

The deadline to submit work for "Pulp: Book and Paper Arts" at Sebastopol Center for the Arts is coming up quickly. **Deadline for submissions is Monday, June 27.**

We're looking for innovative or traditional explorations of book arts, paper arts, and paper sculptures, including paper objects, book-art-related objects, altered books, and sculptural and wall-mounted pieces, as well as more traditional artists' books, letterpress printing and bookbinding. Jurors are Alicia Bailey and Helen Hiebert; Show coordinators are Renee Owen and Jennylynn Hall.

Alicia Bailey, curator and artist, is currently the director of Abecedarian Books. She has been working with book forms since the mid-nineties, has owned and run a successful gallery dedicated to book arts, and is the visionary and curator behind the annual Artists' Book Cornucopia.

Helen Hiebert is a Colorado artist who constructs installations, sculptures, films, and artists' books and works in paper using handmade paper as her primary medium. She teaches, lectures and exhibits her work internationally and online, and is the author of several how-to books about papermaking and paper crafts.

The exhibition runs from July 23 to Sept. 3, 2022.

LIBRARY SUMMER READING CHALLENGE DELIVERS FUN, LEARNING AND PRIZES JUNE 6 - AUGUST 13



Join the Sonoma County Library's <u>Summer Reading Challenge</u> for exploration, learning and fun. The Summer Reading Challenge runs from June 6 to August 13 and participants of all ages are challenged to read 20 minutes each day. The library's summer reading offerings include the reading challenge, a <u>community scavenger hunt</u> and virtual and inperson <u>events</u>.

Sign up for the challenge and track your reading online at <u>sonomalibrary.beanstack.org</u>, with the Beanstack Tracker app or by <u>visiting your local library branch</u> for paper logs.

"Sonoma County Library's Summer Reading Challenge celebrates learning—your way. Read something that sparks your curiosity for at least 20 minutes a day. Reading together is a great way to connect with family and friends," said Aleta Dimas, Adult Services Administrator at the Sonoma County Library. "Join us by reading wherever, however and whatever you enjoy, to foster a lifetime of learning!"

Children who don't read during the summer can lose up to two months of learning by the time they return to school in the fall, a concept known as the "summer slide." Reading programs work to prevent this loss of information.

eBooks, audiobooks, eAudiobooks, physical books, graphic novels and even books read out loud by a loved one, all reading counts. Record your minutes regularly to be eligible for weekly raffle prizes. Plus, earn free books when you read for eight hours and again at 16 hours. Reading time must be recorded via Beanstack—or turned in by paper log—by August 13 to be eligible for the grand prize raffle.
