SPECIAL MEETINGS JUNE 23 & 30 TO PLAN PROCESS TO ADDRESS COMMUNITY PUBLIC SAFETY CONCERNS

At its June 16th City Council Meeting, the City Council approved two special meetings to plan a process to address community concerns regarding police policies and racism and nurturing a safe and healthy community. Meetings are held virtually via Zoom.

The first meeting took place on June 23rd at 7:00 PM and covered specific information about the City's law enforcement policies and procedures and planning next steps to facilitate more community input. View a recording of the meeting [here](#).

NEW HANDWASHING STATION LOCATIONS IN DOWNTOWN SEBASTOPOL



In an early response to help make our community safer during the COVID-19 pandemic, the City of Sebastopol set up a number of handwashing stations throughout the downtown area in mid-March.

In the meantime, we've added more locations and re-located some of the stations to be more convenient, including new portable restrooms and handwash facilities on Morris Street for homeless support services.

Current locations are:

- 1) City Parking Lot at Main St. and Burnett
- 2) North Main St., mid-block (south side of street between Bodega and Wilton)
- 3) 328 N. Main Street - On sidewalk entrance Community Bank parking lot
- 4) Adjacent to southwest corner of Town Plaza parking lot against rear wall of Silk Moon
- 5) Sebastopol Ave. (Route 12) at alley between Ramen Gaijin and WestAmerica Bank
- 6) 6902 Sebastopol Ave - Screamin' Mimi's Ice Cream- at side window on Petaluma Ave
- 7) & 7A) Outside public restrooms on east side of Town Plaza. There are also portable toilets at this location.
- 8) & 8A) Morris St. north of Laguna Park Way, northeast side of street. There are also portable toilets at this location

BASIC SAFETY AWARENESS COURSE - WEDNESDAY, JULY 1, 2020

The class, hosted by [ResQFast](#), covers basic safety and situational awareness in Wildland and Suburban fire, earthquake and other disasters. Other topics include natural/propane gas, power line, wildland fire and hazardous material safety and how to utilize a fire extinguisher and some lifesaving tactics when living in apartments and mobile homes.

The event is free for several groups including Northbay COAD (Community Organizations Active in Disasters) members, DSW (Disaster Service Workers), CVNL (Center for Volunteer and Nonprofit Leadership), CERT (Community Emergency Response Teams) and COPE (Communities Organizing to Prepare for Emergencies), teachers, faith groups, youth group leaders, teen and college students, county/municipal staff, community leaders, veterinarians, and health care workers— anyone engaged with organizations or agencies working to strengthen local and regional resources.

Because the training is virtual, it has been opened up to the general public who are not among any of these categories for a fee of \$20.

We will discuss in depth power line safety, propane/natural gas safety and other hazards you may encounter in disaster situations.

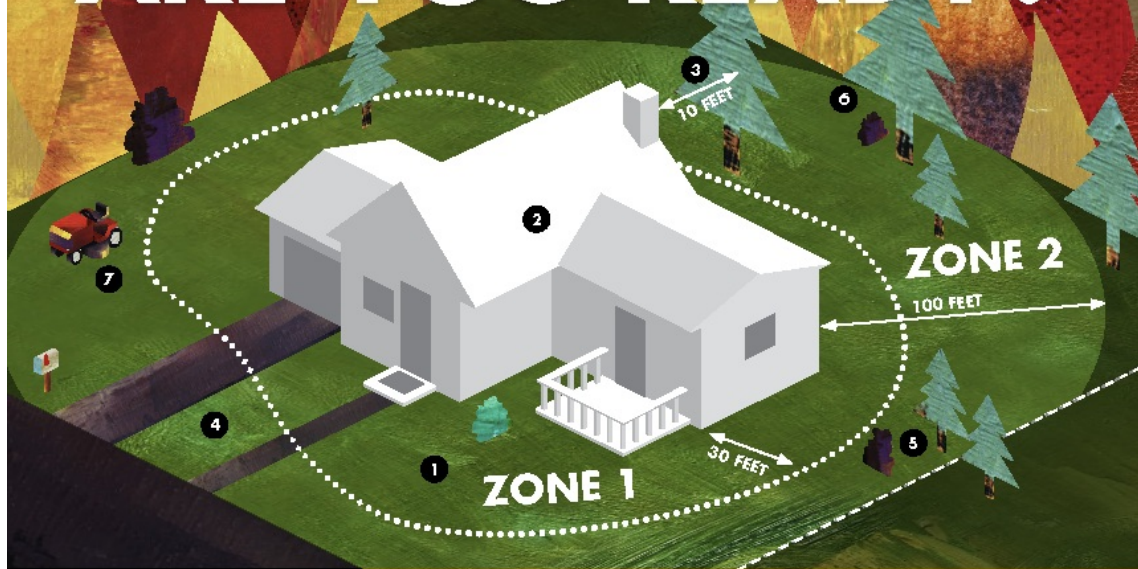

WILDFIRE IS COMING. ARE YOU READY?



Defensible Space is your property's front line defense against wildfire. Creating and maintaining defensible space around your home can dramatically increase your home's chance of surviving a wildfire and improves the safety of firefighters defending your property. 100 feet of defensible space is required by law.*

TWO ZONES MAKE UP THE REQUIRED 100 FEET OF DEFENSIBLE SPACE:

ZONE 1: 30 feet of Lean, Clean & Green

- 1 Remove all dead plants, grass and weeds.
- 2 Remove dead or dry leaves and pine needles from your yard, roof and rain gutters.
- 3 Keep tree branches 10 feet away from your chimney and other trees.

ZONE 2: 30-100 feet of Reduced Fuel

- 4 Cut or mow annual grass down to a maximum height of 4 inches.
- 5 Create horizontal spacing between shrubs and trees.
- 6 Create vertical spacing between grass, shrubs and trees.

Use Equipment Properly to Keep from Sparking a Wildfire

- 7 Mow before 10 a.m., and never on a hot or windy day. String trimmers are a safer option (vs. lawnmowers) for clearing vegetation.



VERTICAL SPACING

Large trees do not have to be cut and removed as long as all of the plants beneath them are removed. This eliminates a vertical "fire ladder."



HORIZONTAL SPACING

Create horizontal and vertical spacing between plants, the amount of spacing will depend on how steep the slope is and the size of the plants.

WATER CONSERVATION

Please continue to practice water conservation as much as possible. Things are green now, but California is still technically in a drought, with Sonoma County showing "Moderate Drought" conditions. Click [here](#) for more information.

REMINDER: CONTINUE TO FOLLOW HEALTH ORDER GUIDELINES

The most current order from the County Health Officer was released on June 5, 2020. The order, No. C19-14: Stay Well Sonoma County, extends the Shelter in Place, allowing more businesses to operate in the County.

As businesses continue to open up and more activities are allowed to resume they are still

subject to the requirements for social distancing, hygiene, and face coverings, as well as any specific protocols or business-specific guidance.

BROAD COVID-19 VIRAL TESTING NOW AVAILABLE

Get tested and help Sonoma County open safely. Viral tests are quick, easy, and free.

Community-wide testing is a critical step toward re-opening the County and allows us to identify and increase our understanding of COVID-19 community transmission. This includes collecting a broad sample of results from people with or without symptoms. We know that upwards of 40% of people who test positive experience no symptoms (asymptomatic), but are still spreading the disease.

Those who are tested will be assessed for the need to quarantine. Only those individuals with a temperature and flu-like symptoms will be required to quarantine while they await test results. Most will be free to continue their regular shelter in place while they await their test results.

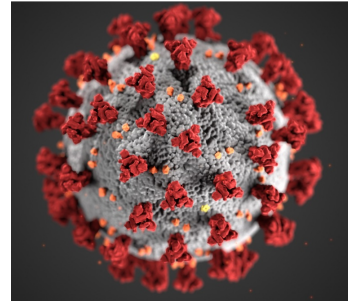

ESSENTIAL SERVICES WILL CONTINUE:

- **The City of Sebastopol will not turn off water due to nonpayment.** The City recognizes the hardship that the pandemic and resulting Shelter in Place Orders, have created in our community, and will temporarily suspend non-emergency turnoffs and late fees.

- **PG&E will not cut off power due to nonpayment.** PG&E voluntarily implemented a moratorium on service disconnections for non-payment, effective immediately. This suspension will apply to both residential and commercial customers and will remain in effect until further notice.
- **Recology will not suspend trash service due to nonpayment.** Recology understands that customers are starting to request delay of payments or payment plans due to the circumstances, and they are sensitive to what the community is going through. Recology will not stop service due to non-payment at this time.

DON'T FLUSH WIPES!



Flushing wipes, paper towels and similar products down toilets will clog sewers and cause backups and overflows at wastewater treatment facilities, creating an additional public health risk in the midst of the coronavirus pandemic. Please do not flush disinfectant wipes or paper towels down the toilet.

TIPS: GOING TO THE DOCTOR OR GETTING MEDICINE

The CDC offers some helpful tips for going to the doctor or getting medicine:

Talk to your doctor online, by phone, or email

Talk to your doctor about rescheduling procedures that are not urgently needed

If you must visit in person, protect yourself and others

Limit in-person visits to the pharmacy

Plan to order and pick up all your prescriptions at the same time

If possible, call orders in ahead of time, use drive-thru windows, curbside services, mail-order, or other delivery services

Check with your doctor and pharmacist to see if you can get a larger supply of your medicines
