

The City sought an objective review and analysis that puts SPD's operations into a broader framework of best practices and potential reforms. The report has now been concluded and will be presented to the Council and public for review





- \*While supplies last. Limit one kit per household.

Every drop saved helps maintain water flows in the Russian River and extends reservoir storage levels



### **EVACUATION DRILL ACTIVITY IN THE AREA OF THE SEBASTOPOL CENTER FOR THE ARTS - JUNE 19**

If you see increased traffic and activity in and around Ives Park next Saturday it is because residents of the Camp Meeker and Occidental area are participating in a County of Sonoma evacuation exercise. Participants are practicing evacuation and travel to the Sebastopol Center for the Arts, located at 282 S High St, Sebastopol.

#### ALL OUTDOOR BURNING SUSPENDED

The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) has announced the enactment of a burn suspension, beginning at 12:01 AM Monday, May 10, 2021, which bans all outdoor burning.

According to CAL FIRE, California is entering its second consecutive dry year and is bracing for what could be another devastating wildfire season. While wildfires are a natural part of California's landscape, the fire season in California and across the West is starting earlier and



ending later each year. Climate change is considered a key driver of this trend. Warmer spring and summer temperatures, reduced snowpack, and earlier spring snowmelt create

longer and more intense dry seasons that increase moisture stress on vegetation and make forests more susceptible to severe wildfire.

The increasing fire danger posed by dead grass and hotter, drier conditions in the region is prompting CAL FIRE to suspend all burn permits for outdoor residential burning within the State Responsibility Areas of Sonoma, Lake, Napa, Solano, Yolo and Colusa counties. This suspension takes effect Monday May 10, 2021, and bans all residential outdoor burning of landscape debris such as branches and leaves.

#### NO FIREWORKS IN SEBASTOPOL





From May 7, 2021 to May 28, 2021, the City of Sebastopol conducted a survey to determine public sentiment about continuing the temporary approval of parklets throughout the survey. The survey was promoted through paid and organic promotion on the city's Facebook page, NextDoor, and Twitter as well as via the Townsy newsletter and app. It was also distributed to all businesses, many of which posted the survey at their locations and in the

There were 583 responses to the survey. 55% of respondents have used a Sebastopol parklet while 45% have not. There were various reasons why respondents have not used a parklet, but

### CALIFORNIA WILL ALIGN ITS MASK GUIDANCE WITH THE CDC'S ON JUNE 15, 2021

### Statement from California Health and Human Services Secretary Dr. Mark Ghaly on Mask Guidance

May 17, 2021 - "California has made amazing progress in our fight against COVID-19. With more than 34 million vaccines administered, we now have among the lowest case and positivity rates in the nation. On June 15, California plans to implement the CDC's guidelines around masking to allow fully vaccinated Californians to go without a mask in most indoor settings. This four-week period will give Californians time to prepare for this change while we continue our relentless focus on delivering vaccines, particularly in underserved communities. We urge all Californians to get vaccinated to ensure that infection and hospitalization rates remain low across the state and that we can all return to the activities we love. Until June 15, when California plans to fully reopen the economy, California will <a href="keep our existing guidance">keep our existing guidance</a> around masks in place. As of May 3, 2021, face coverings are no longer required outdoors except at crowded events, and for unvaccinated people, when physical distancing cannot be maintained. In indoor settings outside of one's home, including public transportation and schools, face coverings continue to be required regardless of vaccination status."

#### When Do You Need Your Mask?

The following masking guidance will be in effect until June 15 when California aims to fully reopen the economy.\*

#### **Out in Public**



#### **Everyone**

**Wear a mask** indoors in public places (unless you're eating or drinking).

**Wear a mask** at all times on public transportation.

**Wear a mask** in indoor and outdoor crowded places such as concerts, parades, sporting events, fairs, etc.

If you can maintain physical distance from others, you may go unmasked outdoors.

\*This guidance does not apply to healthcare settings.

<sup>†</sup>You are fully vaccinated two weeks or more after your second dose of Pfizer/Moderna or two weeks after your single dose of the J&J vaccine.

#### **Indoors at Home**



#### If You are Fully Vaccinated ...

You may go unmasked if everyone is vaccinated.

You may go unmasked if those who are unvaccinated are members of a single household, and also at low risk for severe COVID-19 disease.

**Wear a mask** if anyone present is both unvaccinated and at high risk for severe COVID-19 disease.

#### If You are Not Vaccinated...

**Wear a mask** if those who are unvaccinated are from two or more different households (e.g., children from two or more different households).

You may go unmasked if those who are unvaccinated are members of a single household.

### RESIDENTS 12+ YEARS OF AGE ARE NOW ELIGIBLE FOR VACCINES

Sonoma County residents 12+ years of age are now eligible for COVID-19 vaccines at several county clinics and pharmacies across the county.

 As of May 12, all residents in California 12 and older are now eligible for vaccination.



- Children ages 12 to 17 can only receive the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine.
- Vaccine appointments are readily available in the County. Anyone who wants one can get an appointment at one of our many clinics, pharmacies or health centers in the County -- often the same day. All County-supported clinics are accepting walk-in patients.

#### **EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM**

Have you been financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic? Do you need help with rent and utilities? As of April 19, 2021, the County of Sonoma has started providing support to households impacted by COVID-19 through the Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP).

The program will provide payment assistance for tenants who are behind on rent and utilities. ERAP additionally provides options for landlords to participate and receive financial assistance. This program is open to all County residents, regardless

of immigration status, who are renters or landlords requiring rental assistance. Any

community member can apply with any organization on this list regardless of where in Sonoma County they reside. - Indicate if your work will make use of available pedestals or will be "free standing." If the former, how will it be attached to the pedestal? If the latter, how will it be stabilized and secured to the pedestal's embedded attachments?
- The artist's name should appear on all materials submitted.

Sonoma County moved into the orange tier as of April 7th, allowing more businesses to reopen or expand operations indoors.





### SIGN UP FOR ALERTS

Make sure that you have signed up for:

SoCoAlerts; and

Nixle Alerts (either online or by texting your zip code to 888777)

It is important to register for both types of alerts. If you receive Nixle alerts, read them thoroughly and click on any links.

Text Fire or Fuego (for Spanish) to 211-211 for updates.

### **KNOW YOUR ALERTS**

The City of Sebastopol uses multiple notifications and warning systems to make sure emergency alerts are delivered to the people who need the information.



#### **Emergency Alert System (EAS) - No Registration Required**

National public warning system that will interrupt local broadcast to and radio programming to provide an alert in the event of a large-scale emergency.



#### Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) - No Registration Required

Urgent alerts sent as text-like messages to your mobile phone based on your location (you will only receive notification if you are in the area of the emergency). WEAs have three alert categories—Imminent Threat, AMBER, Presidential. You must keep the factory settings on to your WEA- capable phone to receive a WEA.



#### SoCoAlert - Registration Required

Emergency notification service providing Sonoma County first responders the ability to alert residents by landline or mobile phone, text message and email about imminent threats to life and property in specific impacted areas. Register all addresses that you'd like to receive alerts for (work, child's school, etc.). You don't have to be in the location of the emergency to receive alert.

Local news broadcasters to provide updates during an emergency. Tune radio to 1350 AM, 103.5 FM, 100.1 FM, 89.1 FM (bilingual), 98.7 FM (Spanish); watch preferred local TV news channel.



#### Hi/Lo Sirens

Sebastopol police cars and fire department vehicles are outfitted with new Hi/Lo sirens, a different sound than traditional sirens. This European-style, 2-tone siren will only be used in an emergency to alert residents within specific areas of the need to evacuate.


