

WARNING!

A catalytic converter is located underneath your car and is

attached to your exhaust system. Since catalytic converters contain expensive metals like platinum, palladium and rhodium, they are often stolen and "scrapped" for a quick profit. Thieves often use power saws in the middle of the night to quickly cut the converters



off. The City of Sebastopol and other parts of Sonoma County have recently seen an increase in the number of catalytic converter thefts. If you have a Toyota Prius, you're most at risk.

Below are some prevention tips that can help reduce your risk.

- Parking in your enclosed garage is always best.
- If parked outside, park in front of high-resolution security cameras and motion lights.
- Install a catalytic converter protection device (usually around \$500).
- Etch your converter with your vehicle's license plate number in several different locations.
- If your converter is stolen, file a police report immediately after the theft is discovered.
- Spread community awareness. Thieves sometimes strike repeatedly in the same neighborhoods so it's good for the neighbors to be aware.

WATER CONSERVATION TIPS FROM THE CALIFORNIA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) is

committed to supporting and encouraging both water and energy conservation throughout the state.

Did you know that almost 20 percent of electricity and more than 30 percent of natural gas is used to treat, transport, and use water? It's a win-win situation - when you save water, you save energy too!

Below are some tips for you and your family to save water and energy. By working together, we can save the environment.



- Install water-saving devices. You can save water by installing low-flow showerheads, high-efficiency toilets, and kitchen/bathroom faucet aerators. Check with your utility you may be able to get these devices at a discount, or for free.
- Take shorter showers. Reduce your shower by 1-2 minutes and save 5 gallons.
- Turn water off while brushing your teeth. Save 3 gallons.
- Fix leaky faucets. Save up to 20 gallons per day.
- Wash a full load of laundry. Save 15 to 50 gallons per load.
- Use a broom instead of a hose. You can save as much as 100 gallons of water cleaning your driveway by sweeping instead of using the hose. Plus, it's good exercise!
- Water before 8 a.m. You can save about 25 gallons each time you water by watering before 8 a.m. Watering early reduces evaporation and puts that water to work helping your plants grow.
- Make the switch from lawn to xeriscape (low-water use landscaping). Switch
 your garden from turf to drought-tolerant plants and reduce your household water
 use by more than 30 percent. Outdoor water use accounts for between 50 to 70
 percent of all household water use!

SONOMA CLEAN POWER OFFERS BIKE ELECTRIC INCENTIVE PROGRAM FOR INCOME-QUALIFIED CUSTOMERS



Replace car rides and commutes to work with a clean electric bicycle!

Sonoma Clean Power has launched a new program to help connect residents in need of personal transportation with incentives for electric bicycles (eBikes).

Sonoma Clean Power customers who qualify for CARE/FERA, CalFresh/SNAP, LIHEAP, Head Start, and other income-based assistance programs can apply to receive \$1,000 off the purchase of an eBike from participating local bike retailers.

Through the "Bike Electric" program, SCP hopes to stimulate the local eBike market, further support the adoption of clean modes of transportation, and make eBikes accessible to residents who could benefit most from owning one.





ASK SLOW CAT!





THIS WEEK'S QUESTION: I am curious to learn more about the section in the north west corner near the intersection of Bodega and Pleasant Hill. There is a grouping of burial sites there with Asian characters (none of which I can read) that look to be very old and I would like to learn more about them. What is their history here? Are they some of the first immigrants here? Was there a strong Asian community here when the area was being settled?

ANSWER: My friend Mary Paul Dodgion at the Western Sonoma County Historical Society (WSCHS) and West County Museum pointed me to the fascinating story behind the discovery of this once-forgotten section of the Sebastopol Memorial Lawn Cemetery in a 2016 article from Sonoma West Times & News. The article details a veritable detective story and collaborative effort between Historical Society volunteers and members of the Enmanji Buddhist Temple. The short answer to your question is that, although Sebastopol did indeed have a Chinatown at one point in its history, according to the article the section of the cemetery that you mention is the resting place of Japanese residents. Some of the headstones date back to the 1800's. Mary also shared the following: "One of our volunteers, Brad Duval, was inspirational in researching this section of the cemetery. He has compiled a binder which has the obituaries, some death certificates, and locations of the headstones. The binder is in our Museum Reference Room." My other museum friend Donna Pittman adds, "volunteer Jim Passage also helped in this effort."

Two other great resources are the books "Images of America: Sebastopol," by The Western Sonoma County Historical Society and "Sebastopol's Historic Cemetery: a serendipitous directory of pioneers and citizens residing therein,"

by former Sebastopol resident and former museum director Evelyn S. McClure. And, I would also like to put in a plug for the wonderful "Cemetery Walk" tour, historical re-enactment, and dinner that the WSCHS put on for many years every October in pre-pandemic times and will hopefully revive in the future. You didn't know Slow Cat got around so much, did you? Cats have been known to hang around in cemeteries from time to time! Have a question about the town we all know and love? 
GET TESTED

COVID-19 & HEALTH UPDATES

SONOMA COUNTY'S REGIONAL STAY HOME ORDER LIFTED

The California Department of Public Health has lifted the Regional Stay-Home Order for the 11-county Bay Area region, including Sonoma County, effective immediately. Sonoma County, will remain in the purple tier under the Blueprint for a Safer Economy, meaning many restrictions will remain in place. Under the purple tier, outdoor gatherings are permitted with up to three households and personal care businesses can open with modifications.

The following are permitted to operate only outdoors with modifications:

- Movie theaters
- Wineries
- Restaurants
- · Family entertainment centers
- Museums, zoos, and aquariums
- Gyms
- Places of worship





EMERGENCY SAFETY & PREPAREDNESS

HAVE YOUR GO BAGS READY!

Are you prepared to evacuate if necessary? Are your go bags ready?



Even though Sebastopol hasn't been under any evacuation orders or warnings, all citizens should be prepared to evacuate in the event one becomes necessary.

Everyone in your family should have their own Go Bag that contains a minimum of 72 hours worth of essential supplies. Personalize kits and keep them where they can easily be reached—at home, in the car, at work or school.

This is particularly important during fire season

when a quick getaway may be needed. A backpack or other small bag is best for these kits so that they can be easily carried in an evacuation. During the COVID-19 pandemic additional considerations for your Go Bag include cloth face coverings, hand sanitizer, anti-bacterial wipes, and a thermometer.



It is important to register for both types of alerts. If you receive Nixle alerts, read them thoroughly and click on any links.

KNOW YOUR ALERTS

The City of Sebastopol uses multiple notifications and warning systems to make sure emergency alerts are delivered to the people who need the information.



Emergency Alert System (EAS) - No Registration Required

National public warning system that will interrupt local broadcast tv and radio programming to provide an alert in the event of a large-scale emergency.



Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) - No Registration Required

Urgent alerts sent as text-like messages to your mobile phone based on your location (you will only receive notification if you are in the area of the emergency). WEAs have three alert categories—Imminent Threat, AMBER, Presidential. You must keep the factory settings on to your WEA- capable phone to receive a WEA.



SoCoAlert - Registration Required

Emergency notification service providing Sonoma County first responders the ability to alert residents by landline or mobile phone, text message and email about imminent threats to life and property in specific impacted areas. Register all addresses that you'd like to receive alerts for (work, child's school, etc.). You don't have to be in the location of the emergency to receive alert.

Must register at <u>SoCoAlert.com</u> OR call (866) 939-0911, press "0" at the menu, ask operator for assistance with registering for SoCoAlert.



Nixle - Registration Required

Community information service managed by Sonoma County Fire District and Sonoma County Sheriff's Office. Community messages are sent to email, and for critical emergencies, Alert messages are sent via text message and email (notifications are NOT delivered by phone call). Customize your settings at nixle.com to control which types of notifications you receive. Must register at nixle.com or text your zip code to 888-777



Local Radio and Television

Local news broadcasters to provide updates during an emergency. Tune radio to 1350 AM, 103.5 FM, 100.1 FM, 89.1 FM (bilingual), 98.7 FM (Spanish); watch preferred local TV news channel.



Hi/Lo Sirens

Sebastopol police cars and fire department vehicles are outfitted with new Hi/Lo sirens, a different sound than traditional sirens. This European-style, 2-tone siren will only be used in an emergency to alert residents within specific areas of the need to evacuate.

ARE YOU FLOOD READY?

The rainy season runs from October to May. The most severe flooding historically occurs between December and March. During this time you should be aware of anticipated weather conditions and take appropriate actions.

Know the flood warning signals: The Police, Fire Department, Public Works Department and Emergency Manager for the city are notified of rising floodwaters. Listen for Flood Warnings on local TV, and radio station KRSO 1350. Sign up for local alerts on your mobile phone. Be sure to heed the flood warnings.



Flood safety:

Do not walk through flowing water. Drowning is the number one cause of flood deaths. Currents can be deceptive; six inches of moving water can knock you off your feet. Use a pole or stick to ensure the ground is still there before you go through an area where the water is flowing. Avoid contact with floodwaters. Do not allow children or pets play in floodwater. This water may be contaminated and poses a health hazard.

Do not drive through a flooded area. More people drown in their cars than anywhere else.

Don't drive around road barriers; the road or bridge may be washed out.

Stay away from power lines and electrical wires. The number two Killer after drowning is electrocution. Electrical current can travel through water. Report downed power lines to PG&E or call 911.

Be alert for gas leaks. Use a flashlight to inspect damage. Don't smoke or use candles,



lanterns, or open flames until you are positive the gas service is turned off and the area has been ventilated.

Sandbags

During the storm season, the Public Works Department offers free sand and sandbags behind the Youth Annex at 425 Morris Street. Please note, this is a self-serve area without night lighting. Shovels, bags, and sand (of course) are provided.

What can you do now to prepare?

Find out if you live in or near a flood zone Have a personal/family emergency plan Have personal/family/pet disaster kits prepared

REMEMBER: Turn around, don't drown




