#### THE LAGUNA PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE IS IN PLACE!

When the seasonal floating bridge goes up, summer can't be far behind. Public Works has just finished installing the bridge, and has also re-opened the Laguna Meadowlark Field trail system. The Laguna de Santa Rosa Wetlands Preserve is ready and waiting for pedestrians and bicyclists to enjoy the outdoors.

Social distancing rules will apply, so be sure to bring a face covering and put it on if you cannot maintain a distance of at least 6 feet between you and anyone who isn't a member of your household.

The bridge is accessed behind the Little League field at the Community Center. Under the current order of the County Health Officer, parking lots at the Youth Annex and Community Center



remain closed. Parking is also not allowed at other access points, so visitors must approach on foot or bike. Dogs are allowed if kept on leash at all times. **Trail Map**

#### **MEETING REVIEWS:**

The Design Review Board held its regular meeting on May 6, 2020, provided feedback, and continued a Design Review application for a major remodel and facade changes to 6950 Burnett Street in downtown Sebastopol.

The Planning Commission will hold a hearing at its regular meeting on May 12, 2020 meeting to consider a Use Permit for a smoke shop at 207 North Main St to continue the non-conforming use.

#### RECENT SHELTER-IN-PLACE ORDER AMENDMENTS

On May 1, 2020 the Sonoma County Health Officer issued a new <u>Shelter-in-Place Order</u>, which among





other changes, reduced restrictions in a number of important employment areas including construction, landscaping services, nurseries, and car and bicycle sales.

On May 7, 2020 the Sonoma County Health Officer amended that Shelter-in-Place Order to reopen retail stores for curbside pickup and delivery, effective 12:01 a.m. on May 8, 2020.

This expansion was made possible by the Governor moving to the initial phase of Stage Two of his Pandemic Resilience Roadmap and the success of the Shelter-In-Place order in Sonoma County in interrupting community transmission of the Coronavirus.

The Health Officer Amendment allows additional lesser-risk businesses to open based on a risk-assessment approach and implements Governor Newsom's plan in Sonoma County.



# **ESSENTIAL SERVICES WILL CONTINUE:**

- The City of Sebastopol will not turn off water due to nonpayment. The City recognizes the hardship that the pandemic and resulting Shelter in Place Orders, have created in our community, and will temporarily suspend non-emergency turnoffs and late fees.
- **PG&E** will not cut off power due to nonpayment. PG&E voluntarily implemented a moratorium on service disconnections for non-payment, effective immediately. This suspension will apply to both residential and commercial customers and will remain in effect until further notice.
- Recology will not suspend trash service due to nonpayment. Recology
  understands that customers are starting to request delay of payments or payment
  plans due to the circumstances, and they are sensitive to what the community is
  going through. Recology will not stop service due to non-payment at this time.
