



The City of Sebastopol and Sonoma County are partnering to make walking and biking safer and more comfortable travel options for people of all ages and abilities. Most of the proposed bike lanes and paths in the Sebastopol area have been completed, with the exception of Bodega Avenue, Ragle Road, and Mill Station Road.

The City and County are applying for state funding to complete these projects to provide pedestrians and bicyclists with greater protection from traffic and make it easier to access local destinations by walking or biking. An important part of the grant application is input from community members, so we would appreciate it if you could take a few minutes to complete a brief survey to tell us about your experience walking or biking along Bodega Avenue, Ragle Road, and Mill Station Road and how you feel about the proposed project.





It's the Sebastopol Community Upcycled heArt Project

The heArt Project is designed to educate and inspire by activating potential in affecting climate change. It is to be created through contributions from the community. This project will symbolize the interconnectivity of all life.

- The Central Art Piece will be a kaleidoscope of upcycled glass housed in a welded case.
- The supporting art pieces will be installed throughout town.



Community artists are invited to create supporting pieces that will:

- explore innovative ways to address the environmental challenges we are currently facing.
- be curated from the abundance that already exists within our lives.
- utilize upcycled materials.
- specifically address subjects under the general category of climate change: water, air, solar, carbon sequestration, social inequities, our waste stream, and consumption.



PG&E PERFORMING ONGOING GAS SAFETY VEGETATION WORK

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) is performing ongoing gas safety vegetation work and our communities can help keep the area above and around the gas transmission pipeline safe.

It's important to keep the area above a gas transmission pipeline clear of structures, trees and brush, as they can block access in an emergency or for critical maintenance work. These types of items can also damage the pipe and potentially cause corrosion which can lead to leaks. That's why, as part of their commitment to safety, PG&E regularly inspects the area above and around the pipeline and partners with customers to address any items that pose a safety concern.



Working Together to Keep the Area Above Gas Pipelines Safe and Clear

The community can help keep the pipeline safe by:

- Calling 811 before starting a digging or landscaping project so any underground utilities can be marked.
- Monitoring and reporting any suspicious activity near pipelines.

- Following the guide to safe landscaping when deciding where to install new trees and plants.
- Ensuring structures are installed at least 14 feet away from the pipeline.




 Check all hose connections for leaks. It's critical that we all do our part to save water.

EMERGENCY SAFETY & PREPAREDNESS



CREATE DEFENSIBLE SPACE AND HARDEN YOUR HOME



Defensible space, coupled with home hardening, is essential to improve your home's chance of surviving a wildfire. Defensible space is the buffer you create between a building on your property and the grass, trees, shrubs, or any wildland area that surround it. This space is needed to slow or stop the spread of wildfire and it helps protect your home from catching fire—either from embers, direct flame contact or radiant heat. Proper defensible space also provides firefighters a safe area to work in, to defend your home.
