#### ALL OUTDOOR BURNING SUSPENDED

The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) has announced the enactment of a burn suspension, beginning at 12:01 AM Monday, May 10, 2021, which bans all outdoor burning.

According to CAL FIRE, California is entering its second consecutive dry year and is bracing for what could be another devastating wildfire season. While wildfires are a natural part of California's landscape, the fire season in California and across the West is starting



earlier and ending later each year. Climate change is considered a key driver of this trend. Warmer spring and summer temperatures, reduced snowpack, and earlier spring snowmelt create longer and more intense dry seasons that increase moisture stress on vegetation and make forests more susceptible to severe wildfire.

The increasing fire danger posed by dead grass and hotter, drier conditions in the region is prompting CAL FIRE to suspend all burn permits for outdoor residential burning within the State Responsibility Areas of Sonoma, Lake, Napa, Solano, Yolo and Colusa counties. This suspension takes effect Monday May 10, 2021, and bans all residential outdoor burning of landscape debris such as branches and leaves.


In collaboration with the School District, the addition of Pickle Ball striping will be included to incorporate an additional outdoor activity that can be utilized by the school as well as the public.

# CALIFORNIA WILL ALIGN ITS MASK GUIDANCE WITH THE CDC'S ON JUNE 15, 2021

### Statement from California Health and Human Services Secretary Dr. Mark Ghaly on Mask Guidance

May 17, 2021 - "California has made amazing progress in our fight against COVID-19. With more than 34 million vaccines administered, we now have among the lowest case and positivity rates in the nation. On June 15, California plans to implement the CDC's guidelines around masking to allow fully vaccinated Californians to go without a mask in most indoor settings. This four-week period will give Californians time to prepare for this change while we continue our relentless focus on delivering vaccines, particularly in underserved communities. We urge all Californians to get vaccinated to ensure that infection and hospitalization rates remain low across the state and that we can all return to the activities we love. Until June 15, when California plans to fully reopen the economy, California will keep our existing guidance around masks in place. As of May 3, 2021, face coverings are no longer required outdoors except at crowded events, and for unvaccinated people, when physical distancing cannot be maintained. In indoor settings outside of one's home, including public transportation and schools, face coverings continue to be required regardless of vaccination status."

#### When Do You Need Your Mask?

The following masking guidance will be in effect until June 15 when California aims to fully reopen the economy.\*

#### **Out in Public**



#### **Everyone**

**Wear a mask** indoors in public places (unless you're eating or drinking).

**Wear a mask** at all times on public transportation.

**Wear a mask** in indoor and outdoor crowded places such as concerts, parades, sporting events, fairs, etc.

If you can maintain physical distance from others, you may go unmasked outdoors.

\*This guidance does not apply to healthcare settings.

<sup>†</sup>You are fully vaccinated two weeks or more after your second dose of Pfizer/Moderna or two weeks after your single dose of the J&J vaccine.

#### **Indoors at Home**



#### If You are Fully Vaccinated ...

You may go unmasked if everyone is vaccinated.

You may go unmasked if those who are unvaccinated are members of a single household, and also at low risk for severe COVID-19 disease.

**Wear a mask** if anyone present is both unvaccinated and at high risk for severe COVID-19 disease.

#### If You are Not Vaccinated...

**Wear a mask** if those who are unvaccinated are from two or more different households (e.g., children from two or more different households).

You may go unmasked if those who are unvaccinated are members of a single household.

# RESIDENTS 12+ YEARS OF AGE ARE NOW ELIGIBLE FOR VACCINES

Sonoma County residents 12+ years of age are now eligible for COVID-19 vaccines at several county clinics and pharmacies across the county.

 As of May 12, all residents in California 12 and older are now eligible for vaccination.



- Children ages 12 to 17 can only receive the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine.
- Vaccine appointments are readily available in the County. Anyone who wants one can get an appointment at one of our many clinics, pharmacies or health centers in the County -- often the same day. All County-supported clinics are accepting walk-in patients.

#### **EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM**

Have you been financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic? Do you need help with rent and utilities? As of April 19, 2021, the County of Sonoma has started providing support to households impacted by COVID-19 through the Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP).

The program will provide payment assistance for tenants who are behind on rent and utilities. ERAP additionally provides options for landlords to participate and receive financial assistance. This program is open to all County residents, regardless

of immigration status, who are renters or landlords requiring rental assistance. Any community member can apply with any organization on this list regardless of where in Sonoma County they reside.

**THIS WEEK'S QUESTION:** Hi Slow Cat - does the City want to be alerted to daytime lawn irrigation?

ANSWER: While we don't want to create a scenario where there is tension between neighbors, the City of Sebastopol Public Works department has created door hangers with tips for water conservation. Please contact Public Works if you see an opportunity where we can

#### Dear Neighbor:

California's water is precious. Saving water is now more important than ever. Please address the following:

- Your sprinklers are watering the pavement.
   Adjusting your sprinkler heads to prevent overspray and runoff will save precious water.
- ☐ Your sprinklers were on during the rain.

  Shutting off your sprinkler system when rain is predicted saves water. It's typically not necessary to water for a week or more following a storm.
- You have a broken sprinkler, and/or your irrigation system is leaking. A broken sprinkler can waste 10 gallons per minute or 100 gallons in a 10-minute cycle. Making repairs right away is important to save water.
- Your sprinklers don't need to run every day. Most landscapes do fine with only 2 or 3 days a week of watering, even less in the winter. To determine when to water, step on your grass. If it springs back, it doesn't need water.
- Your sprinklers are on during the day.
   Watering only in the late evening or the early morning hours reduces water loss from evaporation and wind.

 Water your lawn only when it needs it. Water early in the morning or later in the evening when temperatures are cooler.

SAVE: 25 gallons / each time you water

 Check your sprinkler system frequently and adjust sprinklers so only your lawn is watered and not the house, sidewalk, or street.

SAVE: 15-12 gallons / each time you water

- Choose a water-efficient irrigation system such as drip irrigation for your trees, shrubs, and flowers.

  SAVE: 15 pallons / each time you water
- Water deeply but less frequently to create healthier and stronger landscapes.
- Put a layer of mulch around trees and plants to reduce evaporation and keep the soil cool.
   Organic mulch also improves the soil and prevents weeds.

SAVE: 20-30 gallons / each time you water / 1,000 sq. ft.

Plant drought-resistant trees and plants. SAVE: 30-60 gallons / each time you water / 1,000 sq. ft.

 Use a broom to clean driveways, sidewalks and patios.
 SAVE: 8-18 gallons / minute

Wash cars/boats with a bucket, sponge and hose with self-closing nozzle.

SAVE: 8-18 adlons / minute



# **KNOW YOUR ALERTS**

The City of Sebastopol uses multiple notifications and warning systems to make sure emergency alerts are delivered to the people who need the information.



#### **Emergency Alert System (EAS) - No Registration Required**

National public warning system that will interrupt local broadcast tv and radio programming to provide an alert in the event of a large-scale emergency.



#### Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) - No Registration Required

Urgent alerts sent as text-like messages to your mobile phone based on your location (you will only receive notification if you are in the area of the emergency). WEAs have three alert categories—Imminent Threat, AMBER, Presidential. You must keep the factory settings on to your WEA- capable phone to receive a WEA.



#### SoCoAlert - Registration Required

Emergency notification service providing Sonoma County first responders the ability to alert residents by landline or mobile phone, text message and email about imminent threats to life and property in specific impacted areas. Register all addresses that you'd like to receive alerts for (work, child's school, etc.). You don't have to be in the location of the emergency to receive alert.

Must register at <u>SoCoAlert.com</u> OR call (866) 939-0911, press "0" at the menu, ask operator for assistance with registering for SoCoAlert.



#### Nixle - Registration Required

Community information service managed by Sonoma County Fire District and Sonoma County Sheriff's Office. Community messages are sent to email, and for critical emergencies, Alert messages are sent via text message and email (notifications are NOT delivered by phone call). Customize your settings at nixle.com to control which types of notifications you receive. Must register at <a href="mailto:nixle.com">nixle.com</a> or text your zip code to 888-777



#### **Local Radio and Television**

Local news broadcasters to provide updates during an emergency. Tune radio to 1350 AM, 103.5 FM, 100.1 FM, 89.1 FM (bilingual), 98.7 FM (Spanish); watch preferred local TV news channel.



#### Hi/Lo Sirens

Sebastopol police cars and fire department vehicles are outfitted with new Hi/Lo sirens, a different sound than traditional sirens. This European-style, 2-tone siren will only be used in an emergency to alert residents within specific areas of the need to evacuate.


