CITY COUNCILMEMBERS HAND OUT SEBASTO-PAILS TO BURBANK HEIGHTS & ORCHARDS RESIDENTS

On Friday, August 20th, Sebastopol Vice Mayor Sarah Glade Gurney and Councilmember Patrick Slayter visited with residents at Burbank Heights & Orchards and handed out Sebasto-Pails to help with water conservation.

The residents of Burbank Heights and Orchards are serious about water conservation and offered up their own tips for saving water

including:

- Use organic/biodegradable soap so you can use your saved water to water outdoor plants
- Wash your dishes with soap (having turned off the water) then rinse all together, saving the rinse water for other uses (plants, flushing the toilet)
- Get a timer for your shower. Cut back to 5 minutes, even less
- Shower less often, not once a day.
- "Don't wash your dishes!"
- Use paper plates that can be composted (Recology accepts paper without any plastic or wax)
- Reduce the water in your toilet tank (in the '70s drought, we put bricks in the toilet tank to take up space)
- Collect your veggie washing/rinsing water and reuse it



RECOMMENDATION OF THE COUNTY HEALTH OFFICER: OUTDOOR MASKING IN SCHOOL SETTINGS



The Health Officer strongly recommends outdoor masking for all students and staff at public, private, parochial and charter schools across the county.

This recommendation is based on the high incidence of COVID-19 currently being experienced in our county and the increase in transmissibility of the Delta variant.

Masking in the school setting is already required indoors and the added level of protection of masking outdoors will help minimize the spread of COVID 19 on campus as well as enable students to stay in school and have the fewest possible interruptions to in person learning.

SEBASTOPOL WATER METER SURVEY



The ongoing drought emergency has made water conservation a top priority in our community. The City of Sebastopol is exploring ways to give its water customers tools to gain greater control over their own usage and to be alerted

to leaks in real time.

Many other water providers in our region have found success with cellular water meters and an accompanying app where customers will have instant access to this information.

If you're a Sebastopol Water customer (meaning that you live within Sebastopol City Limits, are not on a well, and receive a bill for your water use from the City of Sebastopol) and haven't already done so, please take a [short survey](#) and let us know if you feel that such a program would be of value. Survey results will be shared with the City Council to help inform their decision-making process about the cellular water meter program. Survey ends October 1.

WATER CONSERVATION TIP OF THE WEEK

Here's this week's tip to help you reduce your water consumption:

- **Run the dishwasher and clothes washer with full loads only. Running the dishwasher only when full can save 2 gallons per day and washing only full loads of clothes can save 15 gallons per day. It's critical that we all do our part to save water.**

As the Sebastopol Buckets were purchased with water enterprise funds we are asking that the buckets be supplied to current residents that have a City of Sebastopol Water account.

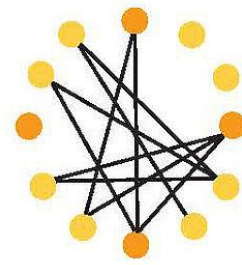

ZERO WASTE SONOMA MINI-GRANTS FOR REUSABLE FOODWARE



Zero Waste Sonoma has a mini-grant program of up to \$250 to help businesses purchase reusable food ware supplies and materials. Eligible expenses for reusable food service ware may include, but are not limited to: baskets, plates, bowls, ramekins, cups, mugs, trays utensils, bulk dispensers, self-service bins, dishwashers, and payment to third-party

support for reuse. Establishing a rentable Party Kit with reusable food ware is another eligible expense.

ARE YOU PREPARED FOR A PUBLIC SAFETY POWER SHUTOFF (PSPS)?



Public Safety Power Shutoff
Tips to Help You and Your Family Prepare

April 2021

At PG&E, our most important responsibility is the safety of our customers and communities. **During severe weather, we may need to turn off power for public safety. This is called a Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS).** We know losing power is disruptive to your work and personal life, so we want to help you prepare. To learn more about PSPS events, visit pge.com/psps.

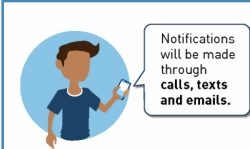
What factors lead to a PSPS?

As each weather situation is unique, we review a combination of factors to decide if power must be turned off. These include:

- Low humidity levels**, generally 30% and below
- Forecast of high winds** above 20 mph and **wind gusts** in excess of ~30-40 mph
- Condition of dry material** on the ground and low moisture content of vegetation
- Red Flag Warning** declared by the National Weather Service
- On-the-ground, real-time observations**

How will you be notified of a PSPS event?

We will share what we know as soon as we can, keeping in mind that weather conditions can be uncertain.



Notifications will include:

- ✓ When power is expected to be **shut off** and **restored**
- ✓ A link to pge.com/pspsupdates with access to:
 - Outage maps
 - Community Resource Center locations
 - Available resources

Are you ready for a potential power outage?

To help prepare for public safety outages, here are some things to consider:

- Update your contact information** and preferred language for PSPS notifications by visiting pge.com/mywildfirealerts or calling 1-866-743-6589.
- Prepare and practice your emergency plan** to ensure that everyone knows what to do.
- Plan for medical needs** like medications that require refrigeration or devices that need power.
- Build and/or restock your emergency supply kit** with flashlights, fresh batteries, first aid supplies, food, water and cash.
- Identify backup charging methods** by visiting pge.com/backupper.

PREPARE FOR WILDFIRE

ASSEMBLE AN EMERGENCY SUPPLY KIT



Put together your emergency supply kit long before a wildfire or other disaster occurs and keep it easily accessible so you can take it with you when you have to evacuate. Plan to be away from your home for an extended period of time. Each person should have a readily accessible emergency supply kit. 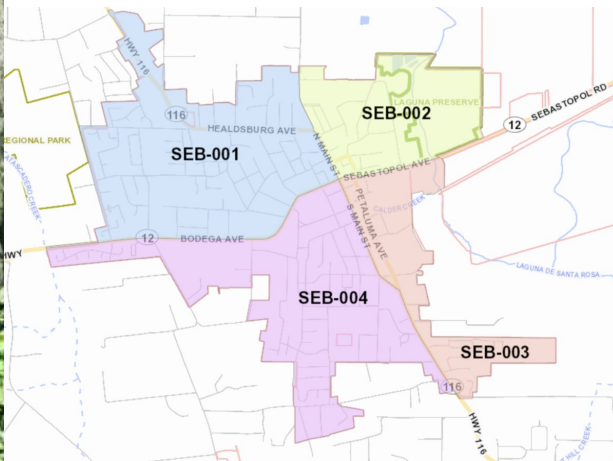

It is important to register for both types of alerts. If you receive Nixle alerts, read them thoroughly and click on any links.

Text Fire or Fuego (for Spanish) to 211-211 for updates.

KNOW YOUR ALERTS

The City of Sebastopol uses multiple notifications and warning systems to make sure emergency alerts are delivered to the people who need the information.



Emergency Alert System (EAS) - No Registration Required

National public warning system that will interrupt local broadcast tv and radio programming to provide an alert in the event of a large-scale emergency.



Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) - No Registration Required

Urgent alerts sent as text-like messages to your mobile phone based on your location (you will only receive notification if you are in the area of the emergency). WEAs have three alert categories– Imminent Threat, AMBER, Presidential. You must keep the factory settings on to your WEA- capable phone to receive a WEA.



SoCoAlert - Registration Required

Emergency notification service providing Sonoma County first responders the ability to alert residents by landline or mobile phone, text message and email about imminent threats to life and property in specific impacted areas. Register all addresses that you'd like to receive alerts for (work, child's school, etc.). You don't have to be in the location of the emergency to receive alert.

Must register at SoCoAlert.com OR call (866) 939-0911, press "0" at the menu, ask operator for assistance with registering for SoCoAlert.



Nixle - Registration Required

Community information service managed by Sonoma County Fire District and Sonoma County Sheriff's Office. Community messages are sent to email, and for critical emergencies, Alert messages are sent via text message and email (notifications are NOT delivered by phone call). Customize your settings at nixle.com to control which types of notifications you receive. Must register at nixle.com or text your zip code to 888-777



Local Radio and Television

Local news broadcasters to provide updates during an emergency. Tune radio to 1350 AM, 103.5 FM, 100.1 FM, 89.1 FM (bilingual), 98.7 FM (Spanish); watch preferred local TV news channel.



Hi/Lo Sirens

Sebastopol police cars and fire department vehicles are outfitted with new Hi/Lo sirens, a different sound than traditional sirens. This European-style, 2-tone siren will only be used in an emergency to alert residents within specific areas of the need to evacuate.
