HOMELESS EMERGENCY DECLARATION & RV SAFE PARKING PILOT PROJECT

Community Meeting Tentatively Scheduled for Dec. 9

In a move to provide safe and humane conditions for the unhoused population of Sebastopol, clear Morris Street encampments, and prevent future unpermitted camping on city streets, the Sebastopol City Council made several important decisions at a special meeting on November 30 attended by some 150 members of the public.

The Council declared a Homeless Emergency and voted to enter into an agreement with [Sonoma Applied Village Services \(SAVS\)](#) to develop and operate a one-year pilot program for an RV village at 845 Gravenstein Highway North (former AmeriGas site). SAVS will set up, manage, supervise, and provide wrap-around services (a team-based, collaborative case management approach that provides support services such as referrals to counseling, food, health care, etc.) at the site.

Additionally, the Council moved to begin the process of creating enforceable parking rules to prevent future unpermitted RV and vehicle camping on city streets. City staff will return to the December 21, 2021 City Council meeting to outline parking rule options. While the bulk of financing for the pilot program has been secured by SAVS, the Council also moved to potentially pay the lease on the privately-owned land (approximately \$60,000) in the unlikely event that it fails to secure grants or other funding.

While the Council would have preferred to extend the community engagement process, in order to take advantage of over \$500,000 of county funding earmarked for the alleviation of homelessness, an agreement had to be in place between the City of Sebastopol and SAVS before December 8.

SONOMA COUNTY REDISTRICTING 2021



After each census, California Boards of Supervisors are mandated to adjust supervisorial district boundaries within the County to reflect the new census data and to keep supervisorial districts substantially equal in population.

On December 7, the Sonoma County Board of Supervisors will introduce an ordinance to adopt the new map. Members of the public are invited to share their feedback in advance of the meeting by emailing redistricting2021@sonoma-county.org.

Sebastopol is located in District 5. The map currently under consideration is "RP Split 3," which does not change any district boundaries within the City of Sebastopol and makes only minor shifts in the unincorporated areas north, south, and east of town.

Winter Holiday Fire Safety



Did you know?

Nearly half of holiday decoration fires happen because decorations are placed too close to a heat source.

It's fun to decorate for the winter holidays, but holiday decorations can increase your risk for a home fire. As you deck the halls this season, be fire smart.

- ✔ Inspect holiday lights each year before you put them up. Throw away light strands with frayed or pinched wires.
- ✔ Water your Christmas tree every day. A dry tree is dangerous because it can catch on fire easily.
- ✔ Consider using battery-operated flameless candles, which can look, smell and feel like real candles.
- ✔ If you do use lit candles, make sure they are in stable holders and place them where they cannot be knocked down easily.

CITY OF SEBASTOPOL FACADE IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS

The City of Sebastopol offers a program aimed at encouraging local businesses and property owners to improve commercial and industrial buildings. Upgrades, maintenance, and aesthetic enhancements will benefit the entire community and enhance the local economy.

With these objectives in mind, subject to funding availability, the Sebastopol Façade Improvement Program will provide a rebate for expenses incurred on new exterior property improvements made to commercial or industrial buildings within the City of Sebastopol.



The program will reimburse a property owner or tenant for 75% of new improvements up to \$2,500. Eligible improvements include painting, new signage, awnings, landscaping, exterior lighting, and local permit fees. Façade building improvements (new windows, changing materials, etc.) are also eligible; however, please note that larger changes may require Design Review approval as well.

The objective of the Façade Improvement Program is to provide an incentive to property owners and/or tenants to enhance the physical appearance of buildings and landscapes. This public/private partnership investment is intended to leverage private capital with public funds for greater community economic benefit.

To apply for the program a building owner or tenant, with the owner's approval, should fill out the attached application and include bid estimates for the proposed improvement(s). The Planning Department then reviews the submitted application for completeness and batches them to be reviewed on a quarterly basis by the Design Review Board for approval. Deadlines for applications for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 are:

- **Tuesday, January 18, 2022**
- **Tuesday, April 19, 2022**

It is anticipated that the Board will hear the Façade Improvement Submittals on February 16, 2022 and May 4, 2022 or May 18, 2022. Note, funding is limited based on the adopted City Budget. Funding may be entirely allotted in early rounds.

Applications are required to be submitted a minimum of two (2) weeks before the scheduled Design Review Board Meeting. If an application is submitted after the quarterly deadline it may be pushed to the following meeting.

ARE YOU PREPARED FOR A PUBLIC SAFETY POWER

SHUTOFF (PSPS)?



Public Safety Power Shutoff Tips to Help You and Your Family Prepare

April 2021

At PG&E, our most important responsibility is the safety of our customers and communities. **During severe weather, we may need to turn off power for public safety. This is called a Public Safety Power Shutoff (PSPS).** We know losing power is disruptive to your work and personal life, so we want to help you prepare. To learn more about PSPS events, visit pge.com/psps.


What factors lead to a PSPS?

As each weather situation is unique, we review a combination of factors to decide if power must be turned off. These include:

- Low humidity levels**, generally 30% and below
- Forecast of high winds** above 20 mph and **wind gusts** in excess of ~30-40 mph
- Condition of dry material** on the ground and low moisture content of vegetation
- Red Flag Warning** declared by the National Weather Service
- On-the-ground, real-time observations**

How will you be notified of a PSPS event?

We will share what we know as soon as we can, keeping in mind that weather conditions can be uncertain.



Notifications will be made through **calls, texts and emails.**

Notifications will include:

- ✓ When power is expected to be **shut off and restored**
- ✓ A link to pge.com/pspsupdates with access to:
 - Outage maps
 - Community Resource Center locations
 - Available resources

Are you ready for a potential power outage?

To help prepare for public safety outages, here are some things to consider:

- Update your contact information** and preferred language for PSPS notifications by visiting pge.com/mywildfirealerts or calling **1-866-743-6589**.
- Prepare and practice your emergency plan** to ensure that everyone knows what to do.
- Plan for medical needs** like medications that require refrigeration or devices that need power.
- Build and/or restock your emergency supply kit** with flashlights, fresh batteries, first aid supplies, food, water and cash.
- Identify backup charging methods** by visiting pge.com/backuppower.

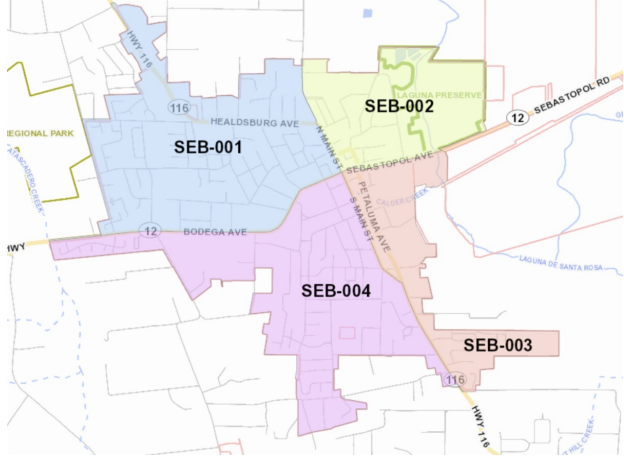
