IVES PARK IMPROVEMENTS FROM ROTARY GRANT AND SPECIAL DONATION

GREAT NEWS!

The City of Sebastopol has been working with our local Rotary service groups on potential improvement projects for Ives Park.

We were notified this weekend that the Rotary Foundation has approved our district grant to implement repairs and improvements to the wood stage as well as replacing the old plastic pipe playground border with an attractive redwood border material.

These Rotary improvements are valued at approximately **\$9,000** and are being donated at no cost to the city.

MORE GREAT NEWS!

Local residents Kurt Noble and Kate Haug made a donation toward the Children's Playground to improve the fencing, install a 36" live Oak, and purchase a redwood Picnic Table from the Probation Camp program. They also donated to the Rotary to help replace the plastic pipe border.

WE NEED YOUR INPUT! PLEASE TAKE THE WATER METER SURVEY TODAY!



The ongoing drought emergency has made water conservation a top priority in our community. The City of Sebastopol is exploring ways to give its water customers tools to gain greater control over their own usage and to be alerted to leaks in real time.

Many other water providers in our region have found success with cellular water meters and an accompanying app where customers will have instant access to this information.

If you're a Sebastopol Water customer (meaning that you live within Sebastopol City Limits, are not on a well, and receive a bill for your water use from the City of Sebastopol) and haven't already done so, please take a short survey and let us know if you feel that such a program would be of value. Survey results will be shared with the City Council to help inform their decision-making

process about the cellular water meter program. Survey ends October 1.

ZERO WASTE SONOMA MINI-GRANTS FOR REUSABLE FOODWARE




Zero Waste Sonoma has a mini-grant program of up to \$250 to help businesses purchase reusable food ware supplies and materials. Eligible expenses for reusable food service ware may include, but are not limited to: baskets, plates, bowls, ramekins, cups, mugs, trays utensils, bulk dispensers, self-service bins, dishwashers, and payment to third-party

support for reuse. Establishing a rentable Party Kit with reusable food ware is another eligible expense.



DO YOU HAVE A FAMILY COMMUNICATION PLAN?




A Family Communication Plan should designate one out-of-area friend or relative as a point of contact to act as the single source of communication among family members in case of separation. It's easier to call or message one person and let them contact others than to try and call everyone when phone, cell, and internet systems can be overloaded or limited during a disaster. SEBASTOPOL EVACUATION MAPS

SIGN UP FOR ALERTS

Make sure that you have signed up for:

SoCoAlerts; and

Nixle Alerts (either online or by texting your zip code to 888777)

It is important to register for both types of alerts. If you receive Nixle alerts, read them thoroughly and click on any links.

Text Fire or Fuego (for Spanish) to 211-211 for updates.

KNOW YOUR ALERTS

The City of Sebastopol uses multiple notifications and warning systems to make sure emergency alerts are delivered to the people who need the information.



Emergency Alert System (EAS) - No Registration Required

National public warning system that will interrupt local broadcast tv and radio programming to provide an alert in the event of a large-scale emergency.



Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) - No Registration Required

Urgent alerts sent as text-like messages to your mobile phone based on your location (you will only receive notification if you are in the area of the emergency). WEAs have three alert categories—Imminent Threat, AMBER, Presidential. You must keep the factory settings on to your WEA- capable phone to receive a WEA.



SoCoAlert - Registration Required

Emergency notification service providing Sonoma County first responders the ability to alert residents by landline or mobile phone, text message and email about imminent threats to life and property in specific impacted areas. Register all addresses that you'd like to receive alerts for (work, child's school, etc.). You don't have to be in the location of the emergency to receive alert.

Must register at SoCoAlert.com OR call (866) 939-0911, press "0" at the menu, ask operator for assistance with registering for SoCoAlert.



Nixle - Registration Required

Community information service managed by Sonoma County Fire District and Sonoma County Sheriff's Office. Community messages are sent to email, and for critical emergencies, Alert messages are sent via text message and email (notifications are NOT delivered by phone call). Customize your settings at nixle.com to control which types of notifications you receive. Must register at nixle.com or text your zip code to 888-777



Local Radio and Television

Local news broadcasters to provide updates during an emergency. Tune radio to 1350 AM, 103.5 FM, 100.1 FM, 89.1 FM (bilingual), 98.7 FM (Spanish); watch preferred local TV news channel.



Hi/Lo Sirens

Sebastopol police cars and fire department vehicles are outfitted with new Hi/Lo sirens, a different sound than traditional sirens. This European-style, 2-tone siren will only be used in an emergency to alert residents within specific areas of the need to evacuate.
