New Polystyrene Ordinance in Sebastopol

Sebastopol City Council has adopted a Polystyrene Ordinance which will prohibit the use and sale of disposable food service ware and other products



containing polystyrene foam. The ordinance will go into effect September 19, 2019 in order to give merchants time to deplete existing stock of these products.

The ordinance also requires food establishments and food providers to provide single use straws and utensils upon request only. This is a "model ordinance" developed by the Sonoma County Waste Management Agency and is planned for similar adoptive actions by the other eight cities and the county fairly soon. Mary Gourley Honored as California's 2019 City Clerk of the Year

The City of Sebastopol is pleased to announce that Assistant City Manager/City Clerk Mary Gourley has been recognized as City Clerk of the Year for the State of California by the 1,087-member City Clerks Association of



California (CCAC). The award is a lifetime honor recognizing City Clerk professionals who have made significant and exemplary contributions to their city, community or profession. Ms. Gourley received the award at the organization's President's Awards Banquet at its annual conference in Anaheim on April 4, 2019.

Ms. Gourley began her career with the City of Sebastopol in 1995 as Clerk to the Planning Director and Superintendent of Public Works; she was promoted to Planning Technician in 1998, and since 2006, she has been the City Clerk for the City of Sebastopol. In 2016, she was promoted to the position of Assistant City Manager/City Clerk.

She is a graduate of the inaugural class of the Sonoma County Local Leadership Academy and, in May of 2013, became Sebastopol's first City Clerk to earn the Certified Municipal Clerk designation. Three years later she achieved her Master Municipal Clerk designation, certification for which requires hundreds of hours of advanced education in the field. Fellow colleagues and staff voted Ms. Gourley City Employee of the Year in 2010 and nominated her for the same award in six of the seven preceding years.

Mary was an honored guest on the Sebastopol City Council Apple Blossom Float and will be recognized at the May 7th City Council Meeting for being named the 2019 State of California City Clerk of the Year.

Spare the Air



Sebastopol is within the jurisdiction of the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAAQMD). For over ten years, the District has had regulations on the books controlling wood smoke. Wood-burning is significantly more polluting than a number of other forms of heating. Smoke is made up of a complex mixture of gases and fine particles produced when wood and other organic matter burn.

The biggest health threat from smoke comes from fine particles (also called particulate matter or PM). These microscopic particles get into your eyes and respiratory system, where they can cause health problems such as burning eyes, runny nose, and illnesses such as bronchitis. Fine particles can also can aggravate chronic heart and lung diseases and are linked to premature deaths in people with these chronic conditions.

The Air District regulations make it illegal to burn wood or fire logs in fireplaces, woodstoves, pellet stoves, outdoor fire pits, or any other wood-burning devices when the Air District issues a Winter Spare the Air Alert. Local media publishes information on 'no-burn days.'
