Neighborhood Communications Update & Fire Extinguisher Classes Sept. 28

Help your neighborhood connect and become more resilient! On September 28 from 9am until noon at the Sebastopol Fire Station on Bodega Ave., participants will receive information and updates on the Map



Your Neighborhood (MYN) program, future MYN class opportunities, and the new MYN Leader Council supporting neighborhood efforts to work together. Attendees will also learn about the new Sebastopol Communications Group (SCG) by watching and listening as they connect "neighborhood-level" information during a simulated emergency using their new network of local Amateur Radio Operators. The SCG will provide information and education on radio equipment and use.

Three one-hour Fire Extinguisher Classes will teach the most effective use of a fire extinguisher and allow students the opportunity to extinguish a live (but contained) fire. Sebastopol Receives \$1.5 Million for Flood Recovery



At the July 16 City Council meeting Assembly Member Marc Levine presented a check for \$1.5 million to the City of Sebastopol to aid in flood recovery. Funds were allocated under "Aid to Local Government" in Assembly Bill 74 in the \$214.8 billion California

2019-2020 State Budget.

Immediately after the flood, Cal OES (Office of Emergency Services) and FEMA conducted a walk-through of the flood area with Mayor Hinton and city officials and worked with city staff to assess damages and estimate recovery costs. Initial estimates showed over \$3 million in physical damage to Cityowned properties and \$168,000 in overtime and fuel costs for the City's Public Works and Building & Safety Departments.

The Budget Subcommittee will bring recommendations for distribution of the funds before Council in September.

Bus Buddies Program Returns in September and October

Bus Buddies are back, and so are the free fares on the electric Sebastopol Shuttle (Route 24). The City Council again approved the annual subsidy to keep Route 24 fare-free. Every Thursday in September and October, community leaders including the mayor and members of the City Council will be your "Bus



Buddy" for a loop around town. Hop on at the Transit Hub on McKinley Street near the Rialto at 9:15 am (or anywhere along the route). In related news, Sonoma County Transit has added a new morning trip at 7:45 to allow commutes to the Sebastopol Charter School. Sebastopol is EverGreen

The City of Sebastopol will soon be powered by Sonoma Clean Power's EverGreen service. The locally produced power is 100% renewable and is comprised of multiple sources such as hydropower, geothermal, solar, biomass, and wind, which will



help remove most greenhouse discharge from electricity use. It is set to power all city-owned equipment. The shift in utility providers will cost the city an additional \$41,500 a year.

New Online Tool Estimates Costs to Build an Accessory Dwelling Unit



The City of Sebastopol is partnering with Sonoma County and other Sonoma cities, and the County of Napa, to develop a regional Accessory Dwelling Unit Calculator (http://sonomanapa.aducalculator.org/) to encourage our

constituents to build accessory dwelling units (ADUs). This online tool helps individuals estimate the costs, returns, and benefits associated with building an ADU.

Based on San Mateo County's Second Unit Calculator, the Sonoma/Napa calculator was developed with funding from ABAG/MTC, the California Department of Housing and Community Development, Community Foundation Sonoma County, and Napa Valley Community Foundation.
